

eBay generally tries to avoid suspending its members. After all, a member who is in good standing is a member that can earn money for the site. To get suspended from eBay generally requires a member to break rules repeatedly or to ignore warnings from the site. The violations that can get a member suspended usually come with a warning or two before the member is given an eBay account suspension.

One of the fastest ways to get an eBay suspension is [click to continue](#) to relist an item that the site has taken down for rules violations. If you have listed an item that has somehow violated a rule, eBay will pull the listing from the site and send you a warning not to relist the item on the site as it is. If the rules violation was about the way it was listed, the item may be relisted with a different description that doesn't violate rules. However, a banned item, such as human remains, firearms in some areas, alcohol and other items that are not allowed on the site, a relist of the banned item will result in an eBay account suspension.

Another way to get an eBay suspension is to get behind on your eBay bill. Once you have received your monthly eBay invoice, the bill is considered due. If it goes unpaid, you will receive warnings to pay the bill or receive an eBay account suspension. For those who rely on eBay sales, this is an important warning. An eBay suspension means a loss of eBay sales and the accompanying income. Being suspended from eBay Australia can be a harsh experience. With a suspended account, you are not only unable to sell on eBay, you are unable to buy on eBay.

To get back on eBay, comply with all of the rules give to you. If you have been suspended because of a relisted eBay auction that you were warned against relisting, you may be able to get back on eBay by acknowledging the mistake. You can email customer service and offer an apology and offer to study the list of banned items and listing violations and never again to violate the rules. If you have gotten an eBay suspension for getting behind in your bill, pay the bill in full to get your account back in good standing. In many cases, paying the bill will automatically put your account back in action and get you back on eBay.
